STUDENTS

Students join with faculty, staff, and parents in creating goals for themselves for the school year. In order to encourage academic growth, students suggest that they will:

- Keep a reading log of weekly reading (Elementary)
- Read at least 20 minutes each day
- Practice math facts for fluency (repetitive practice) using manipulatives or online

resources (Elementary and Junior High)

- Find real world applications for writing (Junior High and High School)
- Ask for help when needed
- Have a positive attitude about learning and setting individual goals
- Be on time and present for school and class each day
- Make a renewed commitment to completing necessary steps in a timely fashion to be ready for college and career opportunities (High School)

COMMUNICATION IS KEY

We look forward to an exciting and successful year, and we understand that strong communication is key.

We use multiple methods of communication, including website posts, online calendars, social media updates, mass media communications such as texts and electronic reminders, and newspaper and other media outlets. We also rely heavily on two-way communication with parents and other stakeholders through formal and informal conferences, meetings, school events, surveys, phone calls, and notes.

High School:

• 95 % of Priddy High School students in grades 9-12 will score at or above grade level in all core EOC tests by May 2024.
